Transport and Active Travel



We are delighted to see that work is under way to gain access to the Dunbar Station platform from the south side. This will enable many of our residents to walk or cycle to the train.

We are also grateful to members of our Rotary Club who look after the floral displays at the station.





Litter Management

The residents at Newtonlees now have a litter bin in place which has been funded by the Community. This will now be operated by East Lothian Council and is an example of partnership in action.

Housing



An Area Partnership Workshop was held in Bleachingfield on 14th October, led by Rebecca Pringle and Hannah Crowe. The session was both interesting and stimulating and additional actions will be added to the next version of our Area Plan if approved at the November Business Meeting.

Some of the main messages included:

- Specific sites for housing development will not be made public until the end of 2025.
- The Void process has been greatly improved by the Council which will improve the number of available Council Houses at any given time.
- There is a problem with the number of vacant owned properties in Dunbar.
- There is an Affordable Housing Emergency in the County and homelessness continues to be an issue in Dunbar and through out East Lothian.
- The Council face the challenge of needing to improve energy efficiency in Council Housing and providing upgrades to Kitchens, Bathrooms, Windows and Doors while also funding the development of new Council Housing. How does the community think the Council should prioritise these?
