# **Dunbar Banking Hub**







## Valencia



Behind the lorries in the picture stands the Valencia landfill site. No rubbish is being deposited there anymore. The last deliveries were made this summer.

Any lorries you may see going up there are carrying topsoil for the site.

The restoration plan has yet to be approved by East Lothian Council. The Area Partnership has a keen interest in the future maintenance and use of this site.

Tragedy struck during October when the top section of McArthur's Store was lost to fire. As always happens in our Area, the response has been hugely supportive and the steps to rebuild this historic building are already under way, a tribute to the energy of the volunteer Directors of the Harbour Trust.

McArthur's Store is a historic building of great importance to Dunbar's heritage and has been the centre of its fishing industry. Dunbar is so fortunate to still have an inshore fishing fleet, principally landing lobsters and crabs, and the loss of the stores is a blow to our fishermen.

Donations, big or small, go towards supporting Dunbar's fishing community and restoring this historic working building for future generations.

TIt is an important part of the Area Plan to see improved access to public transport, and it is great to see that the improved access to the Southern platform has now been completed. Our hope is that this will encourage active travel to and from the railway station.

# arking charges

There is still no update. The Area Partnership will determine what action to take when it understands what is in the proposal.

What is known is that the ELC proposal is not the same as the summer consultation document and that, in the meantime, the Community Councils in DELAP and the neighbouring areas are reinforcing the views of the community which were positively against the imposition of parking charges.

#### **Grants**

The Shed at East Linton has been supported by the Area Partnership.

To commemorate Armistice Day this year the Shed had poppies displayed in some of their flower boxes.





## Viridor

Viridor's next outage has been moved back from **May to September 2026.** 

Viridor continues to run its We Share Initiative, supporting many of the Area's clubs and third sector organisations, as well as key civic events.

The Community liaison group learned that Viridor is currently increasing its level of soil sampling to keep SEPA and the community informed of the expected improvements in the level of dioxins. Although not believed to be dangerous, the increase in dioxins following Valencia's fire in 2023 was not good, and the Area Partnership is grateful to Viridor for monitoring this for us.
